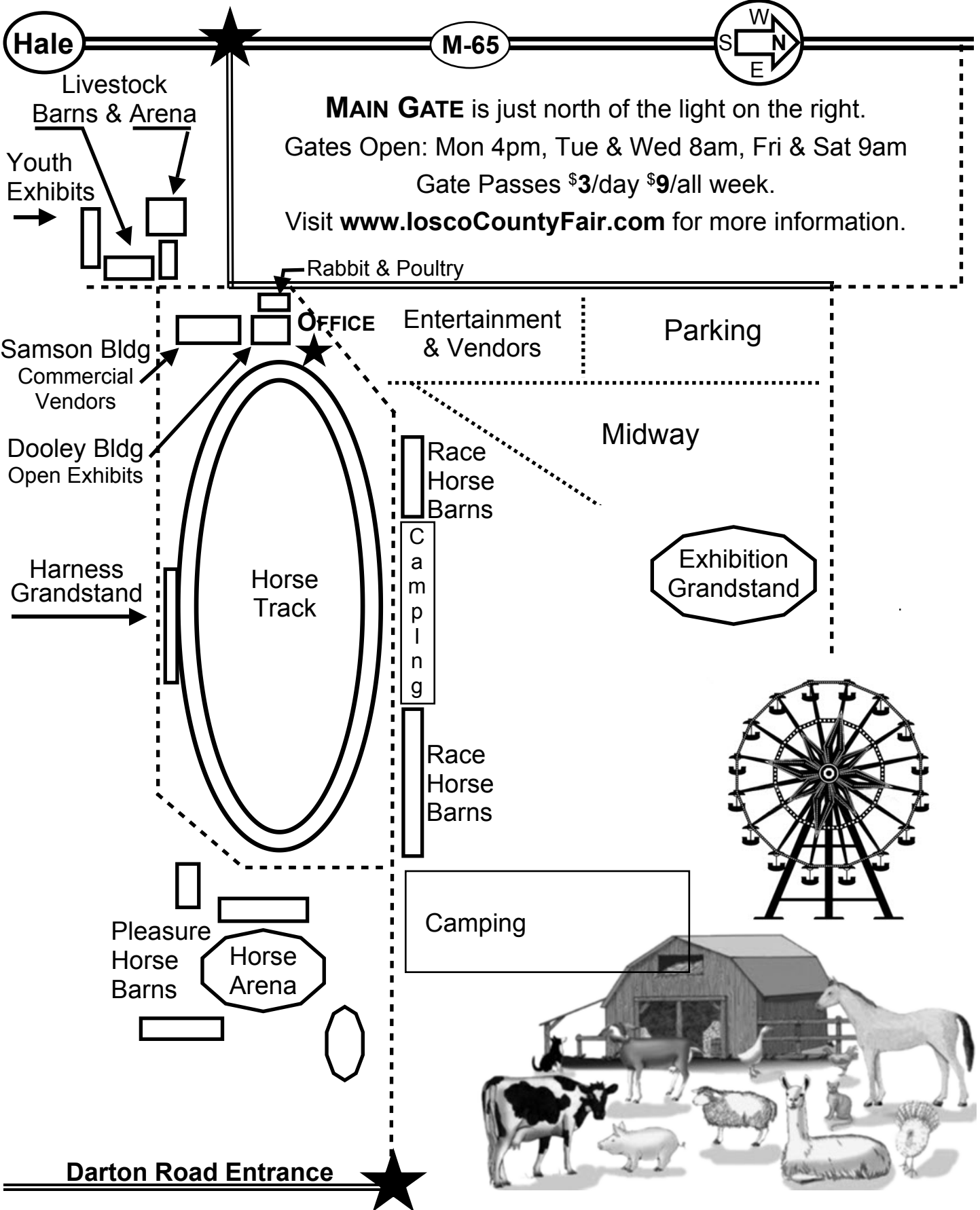

# **DEMOLITION DERBY**

## **Rules and Regulations**

### **BIG CAR PREPARATION**

1. Any passenger type vehicle allowed. No convertibles, utility, T-type, 4-wheel drive, compacts, or sub-compacts.
2. Gas tanks must be removed. A suitable auxiliary tank should be located somewhere in the rear seat floor area. Tanks must be securely mounted and covered.
3. Brakes must be operable.
4. Battery (one only) may be located anywhere, but must be securely mounted and covered. Items # 2,3,4 will be checked prior to entry.
5. Body, frame, bumper, suspension must be stock-stock-stock! No reinforcements or trailer hitches. Drivers door may be reinforced for extra safety. Factory bumper shocks may be welded.
6. All glass must be completely removed.
7. All chrome and die cast pieces must be removed to minimize debris.
8. Trunks must be empty. May be fastened by light wire or small chain. Must be able to see inside.
9. Hoods may be fastened on each corner by light wire or small chain. A hole larger than the air filter must be cut out.
10. Hood bar is mandatory, installed between cowl and roof. It should be bolted at each end, and made of angle iron or chain.
11. Tires filled with air only. Passenger and light truck tires only. No tractor or implement tires.
12. Front doors should be painted white with a clear, visible number on it as a way to identify you and your car.
13. NOTICE: 2006 will be the last year that Imperials, and 71-76 leaf spring wagons will be allowed.

### **DWARF DERBY**

1. Any compact or sub-compact. No convertibles, 4- wheel drive, 2 seated sports cars, pick ups, or camaro type. MAXIMUM 101.5 inch wheel base.
2. Gas tank may stay in stock position if located way under car, or smaller tank moved up inside and covered. MAXIMUM three (3) gallons in tank.
3. A MANDATORY toggle switch will be mounted up on dash in plain sight, marked FUEL, for direct shut off of electric fuel pumps.
4. Entire body, frame, suspension, bumpers, etc. must remain factory stock. No cutting, torching, or welding of anything, no hitches!
5. Only drivers door area may be reinforced. Remove entire hood, or cut away front half.
6. Helmet along with face shield is MANDATORY!
7. Tires filled with air only! Passenger type all season radial or bias ply, no truck type.
8. Big car rules # 3, 4, 6, 7, 8, 12, also apply.
9. Dwarf division is for fun and entry level.

### **BASIC DERBY PROCEDURE**

1. Drivers and crew must sign a waiver to enter. Maximum five people per car. Three enter with entry fee. Others must buy pit pass at \$10.00 each.
2. Must be a least 14 years of age to be in pit area. Must be at least 16 years of age to be a driver. I.D. may be required. No exceptions.
3. No alcohol or drugs will be tolerated, strictly enforced.
4. Same car must be in feature as in heat. Car earns position, not driver.
5. Winning cars may be looked over by fellow participants.
6. Decisions of officials are final! Officials are volunteers and want the derby to be fun and hassle free.

**CAMPGROUND RULES & REGULATIONS**  
**Superintendent: Dennis Wright 989-728-0002**

Campers may start setting up after 3:00 p.m. on Sunday, July 24, 2011 for camping during the week of the fair.  
Camping will be in the camping area north of the horse arena. Available by reservations.

**Camping Costs: \$10.00 per night.**

- Rule 1: A person may camp in a designated campsite only when the established fee is paid and camping permit has been issued.
- Rule 2: A person shall not obtain a camping permit for use by another camping party of which the person is not a member.
- Rule 3: Quiet hours are between 12:00 midnight and 7:00 a.m. All non-campers must leave during quiet hours.
- Rule 4: No more than 1 single family or more than 4 unrelated persons shall camp on 1 site. For the purposes of this rule, a single family shall include a mother or father and their unmarried children. A single family may include relatives if no more than 1 shelter is used.
- Rule 5: **All dogs must be on a leash at site or in trailer. See Rule 8 of General Rules.**
- Rule 6: A "camp" means the use or intended use of any device, shelter, or equipment for the purpose of sleeping or shelter during the nighttime hours.
- Rule 7: A person shall not allow, place, or drive more than 2 motor vehicles onto 1 campsite or into a campground. Additional vehicles must be parked in designated parking areas on the Fairgrounds.
- Rule 8: A registered party shall not leave a campsite continuously unoccupied for a period of 24 hours or longer without written permission from the camping superintendent. A campsite is considered occupied if at least 1 member of the registered party is in attendance during nighttime hours.
- Rule 9: A person shall not use a campground for a permanent or semi-permanent residence or base for the operation of a business.
- Rule 10: Any destruction, damage, or theft of property, trees, shrubs, wild flowers, planted grasses, or vegetation may be subject or fines or dismissal.
- Rule 11: Fires may be built in designated locations or pits (unless a local burning ban is in place). Campers are responsible for supplying their own firewood. Campers must also fill in any pit they dig before leaving.
- Rule 12: Campers shall not dump, place, throw, or leave any litter in the campground or any part of the fairgrounds. All trash shall be put in trash barrels.
- Rule 13: Campers shall not engage in any violent, abusive, loud, boisterous, wanton, obscene or disorderly conduct tending to create a breach of the peace; disturb or annoy others; or remove, damage, or steal the property of another.
- Rule 14: Violations of rules may result in revocation of camping permit, eviction and/or legal action.
- Rule 15: Alcohol is prohibited in all areas of the Fairgrounds, including the campground.
- Rule 16: All people camping & staying overnight on the fairgrounds will be required to camp in areas designated by the losco Co. Agricultural Society.
- Rule 17: No grey water or blackwater dumping on the ground. It must be hauled away.
- Rule 18: Parents or guardians are legally liable for children under the age of 18, and parent or guardian must be in attendance with children at night.
- Rule 19: Golf carts and ATV's are not allowed for use within the fairgrounds unless written permission is given expressly by the losco County Agricultural Society's Board of Directors.

## GENERAL RULES:

- Rule 1: Absolutely no alcoholic beverages on the fairgrounds.
- Rule 2: Pre-registered entries will be accepted Sunday, July 24th, 2:00-4:00.  
**Registration displays must be exhibited by 4:00 p.m. of opening day.  
Monday, July 25th, Entries can begin arriving at 8:00 a.m.**
- Rule 3: Still entries may be removed Sunday, July 31 from 9 a.m. to 12 noon.  
Livestock may be removed from 8 a.m. to 12 noon.
- Rule 4: Awards will be paid according to the record of the Judge's book, not ribbon on exhibit.
- Rule 5: No unauthorized fires allowed on fairgrounds.
- Rule 6: All animals must remain in their designated areas.
- Rule 7: The Iosco County Agricultural Society will not be responsible for injuries and property stolen or lost, at or during the Iosco County Fair.
- Rule 8: Dogs are no longer allowed on the fairgrounds with the exception that dogs will be allowed in camping areas & at specified locations for different dog shows, but only at the time of and for those specific showing events. These dogs must be the animals of the registered camper or dog exhibitor-no guest dogs. All dogs in the campground must be registered at the time of campsite registration. You must present proof on a dog license, the breed and coloring of the dog. All dogs must be leashed or tied at the campsite and must stay on the assigned lot. The dog's owner must clean up all dog droppings. Those not obeying these rules will forfeit the opportunity to camp in the future and have the potential to lose any premiums earned during the current fair year. Dogs causing disturbance to neighboring campers will be required to leave the grounds.
- EXCEPTION:  
Seeing-eye dogs will be allowed in all parts of the fairgrounds but must be cleaned up after. Obedience class dogs will be allowed to be led to and from the judging area at scheduled times only.
- Rule 9: Firearms are prohibited on the grounds with the exception of on duty law enforcement officers and antique firearms being exhibited.
- Rule 10: The Iosco County Fair Board reserves the right to remove any person and/or their exhibit from the grounds for any unsportsman like behavior or for displaying any inappropriate exhibits.
- Rule 11: Golf carts and ATV's are not allowed for use within the fairgrounds unless written permission is given expressly by the Iosco County Agricultural Society's Board of Directors.

## RULES FOR OPEN & YOUTH-per MDA regulation 811

- Rule 1: State-funded premiums shall not be awarded in an animal class where an exhibitor is under 6 years of age by Jan. 1 of the fair year, and who participates as an individual. Youth exhibiting animals under the age of 6 by Jan. 1 of the fair year shall be eligible for state-funded premiums only where separate classes for their age bracket occur, and when youth are accompanied by a parent or guardian during the handling & showing of their animal(s).
- Rule 2: For classes under the educational projects or demonstration projects categories, participants are limited to youth 19 years of age by Jan. 1 of the fair year and younger. Participants 26 years of age by Jan.1 of the fair year or younger, who have been determined to be eligible for special education services by the local school district, may participate in classes under the educational and demonstration projects of the youth department.
- Rule 3: Ownership is not required for an exhibitor to show in any animal classes other than market classes.
- Rule 4: In all categories other than animal, antique or tractor, the exhibitor shall be the creator of the article, item or project.
- Rule 5: State-funded premiums shall not be paid to a class in an antique category that contains an item that has been entered for competition in the previous 3 years. (Items can be displayed but not judged).
- Rule 6: a. Judging shall occur during or not more than 3 days before the opening day of the fair, unless otherwise approved by the director or his or her designee.  
b. All exhibits shall be judged by using the American or Danish system for judging in competition; however, if there is only 1 entry in a class, then the exhibits shall be judged against standards accepted by the fair board.  
c. Judges shall not have a supervisory role at the fair or have an ongoing and direct relationship with any participating exhibitor or employee in the class where he or she is to serve as judge.
- Rule 7: Any fair exhibitor may file a complaint regarding any of the following concerns: A. Conflict or interest of the judge. B. Disqualification of an exhibit or exhibitor. C. Exhibitor, group leader, or superintendent behavior. D. Eligibility of the exhibit. In accordance to the annual appropriation act, exhibitors are allowed to file a written complaint within 10 days after the end of the fair.
- Rule 8: An exhibitor filing a complaint in Rule 7 above may make an appeal to the MI Dept. Of Agriculture-Fair, Exhibitions, & Racing Div. within 45 days of filing the initial complaint if the exhibitor is not satisfied with the fair's action. The department shall have 60 days after receipt of any appropriately filed appeal to investigate the complaint, and shall issue a finding of fact and notice of department action and an recommended actions for the fair.

### OPEN CLASS DEPARTMENTS

These classes are open to all who wish to exhibit, youth & adult. The American Judging System shall be used to judge exhibits in all open classes. Entries will be placed in rank order according to quality (i.e. 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>).

### YOUTH DEPARTMENT

Youth livestock (excluding horses) ages are defined as:  
Pee-Wee 8 & under; Junior 9-14; Senior 15-19;  
by December 1st of the current fair year.  
Pee-Wee youth must be accompanied by a parent or guardian when showing their animals.

## **OPEN CLASS RULES:**

- Rule 1: ENTRY FEE-as listed under each department.
- Rule 2: Premiums offered in each class. There will be one first, one second, one third place paid in each class. If classes are made up the day of entry, ribbons only will be rewarded-NO premiums.
- Rule 3: Exhibits may be eligible for premiums in more than one class if properly qualified.
- Rule 4: No more than two entries from one exhibitor will be accepted in each class.
- Rule 5: The management will not be responsible for any loss, damage or injury to any animal exhibited or article destroyed or in any way injured. Each exhibitor will be responsible for an injury that may be occasioned to any person or to the property of any person by any animal owned or exhibited by an exhibitor; and shall indemnify the management against all claims or injury occasioned by an animal owned or exhibited by him/her or arising from the acts of negligence of the person in charge of any such exhibit.
- Rule 6: Any class where there are fewer entries than premiums offered, prizes will be awarded at the discretion of the judge.
- Rule 7: The judges decisions are final.
- Rule 8: Each purebred animal must be accompanied by it's registration papers in order to be eligible.
- Rule 9: All livestock must be shown to be free from disease before entering the grounds.
- Rule 10: In case the receipts of the fair are insufficient to pay the expenses and premiums, the losco County Fair Board will prorate the premiums.
- Rule 11: The American Judging System shall be used to judge exhibits in all open classes. Entries will be placed in rank order according to quality.

## **YOUTH CLASS RULES:**

- Rule 1: This division is open to any girl or boy 19 years of age and under as of Jan.1 of the fair year.
- Rule 2: No entry fee is required in youth classes.
- Rule 3: The Danish Judging System shall be used to judge youth exhibits. Entries will be judged against an established set of standards. All entries meeting the standards may receive the same or differing awards. Placing will be in the form of A, B, C Award ribbons.
- Rule 4: Exhibitors may enter no more than two entries per class
- Rule 5: No article or work previously exhibited at the losco County Fair will be accepted for competition until at least 2 years have passed.
- Rule 6: All exhibitors with animals are responsible for feeding and caring from them during the fair. Exhibitors are responsible for keeping, animals, pens, etc. clean at all times.
- Rule 7: Exhibitors are to fit, show and take care of their own animals.
- Rule 8: All state sanitary and health regulations must be adhered to.
- Rule 9: Showmanship awards based on: Showmanship of Owner. Fitting of animal. Training of animal. Showmanship classes divided: 14 years old and under (as of Jan. 1) and 15 years old and over (as of Jan. 1)
- Rule 10: All livestock exhibits and the area occupied by them must be kept in order by the exhibitors as directed by the Superintendent in charge.  
Each youth is responsible for his/her own clean-up equipment (rakes, forks, shovels, etc.)
- Rule 11: All vegetables and flowers exhibited must be raised by the exhibitor.
- Rule 12: Baking food exhibits should be shown on 9 inch plates.
- Rule 13: No bulls shall be shown in the Youth Division.
- Rule 14: All livestock shall be shown at halter in the ring in a manner prescribed by the judge.
- Rule 15: In case the receipts of the fair are insufficient to pay the expenses and premiums, the losco County Agricultural Society will prorate the premiums.
- Rule 16: For flowers, fruits, and vegetables: if these produce items are not available at the time of the fair as pre-registered for then another exhibit may be substituted.
- Rule 17: Exhibitors must completely clean their pens/stalls at the end of the fair or forfeit their premium monies.
- Rule 18: Exhibits may only be picked up between 9 a.m. and 12 noon on Sunday, August 1.

## HORSE FACILITY USE RULES

- Rule 1: The superintendent is in charge of all within the horse area, including stall assignments.
- Rule 2: **All horse will be checked for signs of infectious and/or contagious diseases and must present valid Coggins test papers BEFORE unloading horses onto fairgrounds.**
- Rule 3: Removal of sick horses will be at the discretion of the horse superintendent.
- Rule 4: Dogs are not allowed around the barns, sow area or fairgrounds. (See general rules)
- Rule 5: Parking will be allowed in the area west of the barns and in the field to the northeast of the arena.
- Rule 6: No horses in the campground areas or the harness race track, (Exception: Saddle horses entered in the youth or adult horse race competition will be allowed for time of that event).
- Rule 7: No foul language allowed by contestants or their parents/guardians in or around the barns and arena.
- Rule 8: All garbage must be put in trash barrels.
- Rule 9: All manure is to be dumped in the concrete manure pit area only. NOT AROUND IT-IN IT. If the pit is getting full then contact the horse superintendent so they can get it cleaned.
- Rule 10: If the barns are full and you have to be stalled up front in the red or white barns, the horses must enter the horse area at a walk, including walking through the harness horse barn area.
- Rule 11: No "horse play" will be allowed in the horse barns or area. WALK HORSES ONLY.
- Rule 12: Persons with animals stalled in the horse barns may use the sawdust provided by the fair board. However, waste is to be avoided; instead of stripping stalls every time, simply remove manure and wet spots. Each stall used will be allowed two (2) wheelbarrows of sawdust to start with. Then each stall will be allowed one wheelbarrow of sawdust every other day during the week. Any extra needed will be provided by the exhibitor at their own expense.
- Rule 13: Exhibitors will have their stalls and the barn area they occupy cleaned by 10:00 a.m. daily to present a clean barn for fair patrons.
- Rule 14: Aisles shall be kept clean of rakes, shovels, buckets, wheelbarrows, etc.
- Rule 15: All horses are to be cared for by their owners. If owners are not able to be present they MUST find someone to feed and water their horses AT LEAST TWICE DAILY.
- Rule 16: Do not tie buckets to stall cage. It breaks to wires.
- Rule 17: No horses in aisles of any of the barns for any reason. These are for pedestrians only.
- Rule 18: Do not leave horses unattended if outside their stall.
- Rule 19: All horses must be in their stalls by 11:00 pm.-no riding until daylight.
- Rule 20: Lights out at 11:00 p.m. and this may ONLY be extended by the horse superintendent.
- Rule 21: Halters are to be left on your horses while in their stalls.
- Rule 22: Excessive whipping, spurring, or rough treatment of horses will NOT be tolerated.
- Rule 23: All riders MUST wear boots.
- Rule 24: In order to receive fair premiums horse participants have earned during the week of the fair, all horse owners stalling horses must strip and clean the stalls of manure, bedding, and litter before removing horses from the grounds. This will be inspected by the horse superintendent. Also, removing horse before fair is over will result in loss of premiums.

**ADDITIONAL ANIMAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS  
FOR LIVESTOCK ENTERED INTO THE IOSCO COUNTY FAIR**

**Cattle and Goats:** No animal allowed with horns 1.5 inches. All cattle must be identified by an official RFID ear tag. All cattle, to be eligible for awards, must be shown at halter in the show ring in a manner prescribed by the judge. **State of Michigan TB testing requirements must be adhered to. State regulations in effect at the time of the fair, will be followed.**

**Swine:** No swine shall be presented for exhibition purposes that have originated from any garage feeding premises or that are in a quarantined area for the prevention of the spread of vesicular exanthema, or if quarantined is on the premises for any reason.

**Poultry:** It is recommended that all birds exhibited at the fair shall be vaccinated against infectious Bronchitis and Newcastle disease thirty days or more prior to the date of exhibition. Poultry with clinical signs of infectious laryngotracheitis (ILT), also known as respiratory herpes virus, will not be allowed on the fairgrounds, nor will they be allowed to show at the fair. Additionally, poultry vaccinated for ILT will not be allowed to show at the fair either.

**Horse:** Exhibitors of stallions must be 18 years or older, except for the 4-H Standardbred Project group. **All equidae except, foals under 6 months and nursing their dam, entered in fair must test negative to an official Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) test within the current calendar year. Exhibitors must be able to present proof in the form of an official EIA laboratory report.** A fair authority is responsible for assuring that all participating equines are test-negative for EIA.

**Sheep:** Please do not remove tags prior to weigh-in or showing.  
It is illegal to remove official USDA individual animal identification.

**DRUG TESTING POLICY**

The drug testing policy and procedure for the Iosco County Fair is as follows:

**ALL ANIMALS ON THE FAIRGROUNDS ARE SUBJECT TO RANDOM DRUG TESTING AS DETERMINED NECESSARY BY THE ASSOCIATION. THE DRUG TESTING PROCEDURES WILL BE DONE FOLLOWING ESTABLISHED MICHIGAN DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE PROTOCOL.**
